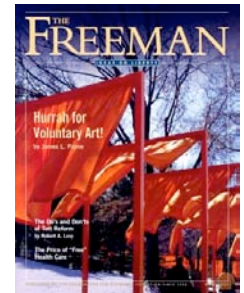
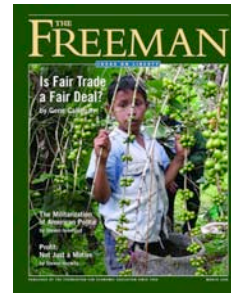

FEE’s flagship publication, *THE FREEMAN*, is available to students at *no charge*.



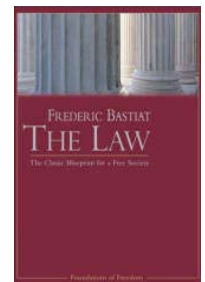
### FEE Essay Contest for Homeschool Students
